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Purpose. The 5-Year and Annual PHA Plans provide a ready source for interested parties to locate basic PHA policies, rules, and requirements concerning the PHA's operations, programs, and services, and informs HUD, families served by the PHA, and members of the public of the PHA's mission, goals and objectives for serving the needs of low- income, very low- income, and extremely low- income families.

Applicability. Form HUD-50075-ST is to be completed annually by **STANDARD PHAs or TROUBLED PHAs**. PHAs that meet the definition of a High Performer PHA, Small PHA, HCV-Only PHA or Qualified PHA do not need to submit this form.

Definitions.

- (1) **High-Performer PHA** – A PHA that owns or manages more than 550 combined public housing units and housing choice vouchers, and was designated as a high performer on both of the most recent Public Housing Assessment System (PHAS) and Section Eight Management Assessment Program (SEMAP) assessments if administering both programs, or PHAS if only administering public housing.
- (2) **Small PHA** - A PHA that is not designated as PHAS or SEMAP troubled, or at risk of being designated as troubled, that owns or manages less than 250 public housing units and any number of vouchers where the total combined units exceeds 550.
- (3) **Housing Choice Voucher (HCV) Only PHA** - A PHA that administers more than 550 HCVs, was not designated as troubled in its most recent SEMAP assessment and does not own or manage public housing.
- (4) **Standard PHA** - A PHA that owns or manages 250 or more public housing units and any number of vouchers where the total combined units exceeds 550, and that was designated as a standard performer in the most recent PHAS or SEMAP assessments.
- (5) **Troubled PHA** - A PHA that achieves an overall PHAS or SEMAP score of less than 60 percent.
- (6) **Qualified PHA** - A PHA with 550 or fewer public housing dwelling units and/or housing choice vouchers combined, and is not PHAS or SEMAP troubled.

Updated heating and air ventilation (HVAC) systems, new roofing, and tankless water heaters will be installed. Water supply and sewer lines will be replaced to correct some major problems with deteriorating lines. Parking bays will be added to developments with inadequate parking space.</p> <p>Four (4) units in Ridgely will be demolished under Section 18 of the Housing Act of 1937. The units were deemed structurally unsound.</p> <p>Dyersburg Housing Authority will seek applicable grant funding that will be beneficial to the residents that are served and the low-income housing properties. A mixed-finance development for the elderly will be constructed or acquired to accommodate the aging population with affordable housing.</p>

B.5	<p>Progress Report.</p> <p>Provide a description of the PHA's progress in meeting its Mission and Goals described in the PHA 5-Year and Annual Plan.</p> <p>Public housing units in the Walker Court development were renovated and completed in Phase 3 with the use of the Capital Fund Grant program. Improvements to the units included the complete renovation of the bathrooms and kitchens, installation of new heating and air conditioning systems, upgraded electrical systems, new LED light fixtures, new flooring, laundry rooms were reconfigured to provide space for both the washing machine and dryer to be together in a designated area, and the installation of new interior and exterior security screen doors. The roofs were replaced with architectural shingles for endurance and strength to wind resistance and other weather conditions.</p> <p>DHA's website has made it convenient for tenants to pay their rent online anytime, and it is no longer necessary for them to wait to pay during business hours.</p> <p>Public housing vacancies have been reduced and occupancy rates have increased during the ongoing pandemic that now includes other strains of COVID-19.</p> <p>Dyersburg Housing Authority continues to provide well-maintained units for the residents and monitors the operations of the developments to ensure that they operate efficiently and effectively.</p>
